Reminder – Yard Waste pickup will be starting back up Friday, April 3rd and will continue on the FIRST and THIRD Friday of each month. Although we do not require limbs to be placed in bags/boxes, we do ask that you bag up any and all leaves.

Dog Pound: Any dog that is running outside the owner's yard without a leash in the city limits is at risk of being taken to the city pound. It is unlawful for any animal to run at large in town.
