Important Reminders: Letters will be mailed to those who are not in compliance.
- *Section 215.015* No person shall leave outside, any material which is unhealthy or unsafe and declared to be a public nuisance including; parts of neglected cars or trucks, tires, broken furniture, old appliances, broken glass, boxes, mattresses, old wood, etc.
- *Section 380.070* No person shall operate or park a motor vehicle without the current and proper registration.



Yard Waste Reminder: Yard Waste pick up is the **FIRST** and **THIRD** Friday of each month. November 16th will be the last brush pick up until after winter.



Utility Tip: Keep your furnace exhaust clear of snow or other debris so Carbon Monoxide can vent from the home properly. Carbon Monoxide is odorless therefore we recommend you purchase a CO detector. You should place the batteries in the detector while outside of the home then install as the instructions state.

Bulk Trash Pickup: Monday, November 11th and Thursday, November 14th. Each customer is limited to 2 appliances per household and construction waste **WILL NOT** be picked up. Check the Facebook page or call the office for more information.

The 2020 Census begins in March. Please be sure to fill the form out and return it. It affects the amount of grants, money to maintain roads, etc. that the City of Paris will be able to receive over the next 10 years. Be sure to account for every child and elder in the home as no child is too young. The census consists of 10 questions and by law, absolutely none of the information will be released to anyone for any reason other than the Census Bureau. If you have not returned the paperwork by May, your address will be visited by a Census Worker until the paperwork is completed. The last Census showed Paris being 6% below the Nation residential rate. Please help get those numbers up by participating as honest as you possibly can.
